

#### **ADHESIVE FAQs**

## 1. Why does this adhesive need flat surfaces?

Hang Your Glass adhesive begins to set and cure in the absence of air. If you are using it to fill gaps then it will not set and cure and therefore fail.

# 2. Is it okay to leave the excess adhesive around the stand-off for extra strength?

Because the Hang Your Glass adhesive begins to set and cure in the absence of air any adhesive left around the stand-off will always remain tacky and turn dark yellow. Remove this excess adhesive with 100% Acetone. This will actually strengthen the bond.

### 3. Is there a difference in using alcohol to 100% Acetone?

We recommend 100% Acetone over alcohol especially when the piece is large and heavy. NO NAIL POLISH REMOVER.

## 4. My activator is turning dark brown and evaporating. Is it okay to use?

The activator turns dark brown when it is introduced to air. If you leave the eye dropper in the bottle it will turn dark brown and slowly evaporate.

# 5. I have an unopened adhesive set but the date is expired. Is this okay to use?

No, once the adhesive expires it begins to lose its integrity. Be sure to use fresh adhesive for the best results.

#### 6. How long does it take to cure?

The adhesive sets in 5-10 minutes. Cures in 48-72 hours. If your adhesive application has not set in 5-10 minutes then pull the stand-off and clean it with 100% Acetone and redo the application.

## 7. Can you use the Hang Your Glass adhesive in outdoor installations?

Yes, the Hang Your Glass adhesive works great indoors and outside.

# 8. Does the adhesive Can you use the Hang Your Glass adhesive in outdoor installations?

#### 9. Does the adhesive yellow?

It does have a honey tint but the stand-off is more noticeable than the adhesive. Just make sure you clean up around the stand-off.

## 10. Can I use heat to speed up the set and cure time?

No, heat will make the adhesive brittle. Just keep the glass in a warm room opposed to adding direct heat.

## 11. Is it okay to attach to glass that was fired on fibre paper?

Yes, that is usually fine. Our rule of thumb is if you can "rock" the stand-off on the glass or see light between the stand-off and the glass you need to cold work that spot or find a different place to attach the stand-off.
